# Community Chairman's Review.

I am pleased to be able to pen this note on the work of the Community Council and Village Hall & Playing Fields Management Committee over the past year. Recently we co-opted two new Community Councillors following the resignation of Cllr. Les Abbot and the untimely passing of Cllr Ryan Davies.

The new Councillors are Mrs Dawn Harries from Maddox Moor and Mr Carl Griffiths from Moorland Road. We also took the opportunity to welcome two new members onto the Village Hall & Playing Field Management Committee, Mr Jamie Streeter from New Road and Mr Ross Harries from Moorland Road. Jamie is Chairman of Governors of Cleddau Reach School and Ross is a governor of Hook School.

The Community Council have been actively engaged with the County Council; over the year in a new era of open dialogue with consultations taking place on secondary school's re-organisation and a charter for better working between the Community, Town and County Councils.

We pushed for certain highway improvements and are pleased with the work done to improve the safety at Lower Freystrop junction together with the extended section of speed restriction. Improved drainage work has been done on Moorland Road and the County Council are promising further work on road surfaces, signage and surface water drainage which has affected certain properties.

Major renovation has been carried out at the Village Hall with a completely refitted kitchen, upgraded toilets and porch together with internal decoration. All of the current users are impressed with the work and it is hoped that this will lead to additional bookings. Information on bookings on page.

We are also pleased that the playing field is being used fairly regularly by Llangwm AFC for their Pembrokeshire League football matches.

We will shortly be setting up a Community website to keep residents better informed of matters of interest and activities in the locality. If this letter is being read by new residents than-I would like to welcome them and hope that they will enjoy living here and participate in local activities.



Peep into Freystrop' Past.

In view of the Chairman's opening remarks this may be of interest to Freystrop Folk. Does this sound familiar!

"Because of the poor condition of the roads and charges at Toll Gate locals took other routes to Haverfordwest.

Llangwm fisher women & coal hawkers from Freystrop took the footpath along the river. Others took the narrow lanes across the moor but these could be dangerous in the dark.

The area between Freystrop Cross & the common was known as Cardmaker's Pool, a rough track for a road way, in wet weather it was almost impassable with mud knee high.

A local committee was formed to raise funds to re-surface the road but only  $\pm$  100 was raised because after the pits were closed the road was only used by a small number of peoples and was ignored by the County Council.

After many years of campaigning the road was finally made up with stone and tarred surface.

It was opened in the late forties with great pageantry some children were transported by bus, others on a tractor & trailer waving flags & wearing paper hats for the opening ceremony".

# Little Nash Christmas Recipe Cabbage or Kale, Mushroom & Sweet Potato Bake.

1lb sweet potato peeled & diced. 2tbs olive or coconut oil. Half red cabbage or kale.

1 red onion thinly sliced.

2 large clove of garlic crushed.

3/4.lb mushrooms.

2 spring onions finely sliced.

6 medium size eggs beaten.

Heat oven to 180 c, gas 4.



Season the sweet potato with salt & pepper and roast in 1tbsn oil for about 30 mins.

Wash cabbage or kale, remove the stems from the leaves & steam for 5 mins. then squeeze dry.

Gently fry onions in a small amount of oil for 5mins until soft. Add the crushed garlic, mushrooms and cook for 3 mins.

Add spring onions. Briefly cook stirring thoroughly in to mixture. Stir in cabbage or kale & sweet potato.

Pour in beaten eggs season and fold into the mixture.

Cook over gentle heat for 7-8 minutes then put in oven for 5 mins until set and brown on top.

Fold in half top with chopped parsley. Serve with green salad or cut into strips for a buffet meal.
