Community Council Chairman's Review



Another year has gone quickly by and the Community Council has been involved over the last year with a variety of mundane but essential issues, such as adopting the new Councils Code of Conduct and getting to grips with the ever increasing financial reporting requirements. On the latter issue we are indebted to Jamie Streeter who has taken on the role of Responsible Financial Officer to look after the Community Councils budgets and Audit requirements.

These seemingly ever increasing administrative matters are taking their toll on Clerks across the County with at least one third of the Clerks out of the 73 Town and Community Councils resigning in the past couple of years. Our Clerk Mrs Kasha Roach has relinquished the role after nearly 30 years of dedicated service. As Chairman I know how much she enjoyed the work and I personally want to thank her for the many years of loyal service. We wish her well for the future.

We continue to deal with planning issues and responding to other requests for comments from a variety of organisations. Pembrokeshire County Council's Local Development Plan will commence a review in mid-2017 and landowners wishing to make submissions for potential developments need to be aware that this will be the last opportunity before 2021.

In May 2017 Community Council elections will be held on the same day as the County Council elections and anyone interested in standing for either Council may do so.

The Village Hall has a regular rota of bookings from the Freystrop WI, Freystrop Short Mat Bowls Club, Line Dancing, Yoga and Age Concern Craft groups which are our main sources of income. Occasional parties are held but we could easily accommodate more especially at weekends (see elsewhere for booking contact numbers).

Little Nash Farm Christmas Recipe



Hot & Sour Turkey Soup

Ingredients: 1 tbsp. vegetable oil, 300g (11-12oz) turkey breast cut into strips, 5cm(2in) root ginger peeled & grated. 4 spring onions finely sliced, 1-2 tbsp. Thai red curry paste, 75g(30z) wild rice, 1.1 litres(2pts) hot chicken stock/vegetable stock or water, 200g(2oz) mangetout sliced, juice of 1 lime.

Method: Heat the oil & stir in turkey for 5 minutes, until browned. Add the ginger and spring onions & cook for 2-3 minutes. Stir in curry paste and cook for a further 2 minutes. Add the rice, stir to coat in curry paste. Add the hot stock stir & bring to the boil. Reduce heat & simmer for 20 minutes. Add the mangetout & cook for 5 minutes or until rice is cooked. Add lime juice. Serve with crusty bread or rolls.

Chilli Jam - Delicious with cold meats.

Ingredients: 1 litre fresh pressed apple juice or a mixture of juice & cider vinegar. 150g red chilli, 150g sweet red peppers. 1Kg Jam Sugar.

Method: Blitz the chilli & pepper complete with seeds in a processor until finely chopped. Add to liquid & cook for about 30 minutes. Add 1 kg jam sugar and stir until dissolved, boil then boil rapidly for 10 minutes until setting point is reached. Finely chop 5-6 shallots and add to the jam. Pour into screw top pots.

Poor Man's Cakes

Ingredients: 500g(1lb) Self-Raising Flour, 250g butter or margarine, pinch of salt, 150g sugar, 1 large cooking apple -grated.

Method: Rub the fat into flour, add the grated apple & mix together to form a stiff dough. Roll out as for Welsh Cakes, cut into rounds. Bake on a hot greased griddle until brown on each side. Serve with butter & sprinkled with sugar.





Peep into Freystrop' Past



It seems that in the past Freystrop was quite a thirsty village, home to several inns. The following taken from Mrs Beryl Davies book "Freystrop Folk". Copies of the book are still available, contact Mrs Davies on 01437 890309.

Troopers Inn at the Freystrop - Llangwm crossroads in 1804 was recorded as a meeting place for the Pembroke Yeomanry before going on "exercise".

Others include The Anchor Inn on the river, The Bumble Bee and The Lamb & Flag in Little Milford, The Whip & Line and The Pelican at Cardmakers Pool, Moorland Road, Rising Sun, Summer Hill, New Road and The Weary Traveller possibly renamed the Travellers Rest, which is the only one still in existence and is now known by its local name "The Tiddly".

The most famous of them all was the Colliers Arms on the cross road alongside the village pound. This pub was known to exist in 1753 as it was part of the Little Milford estate when Caesar Mathias took the lease. In 1822 a joint licence was granted to Martha Cousins and Mark Bennett. The licence stated:

"They should not permit drunkenness or tippling nor getting drunk - no gaming with cards draughts, dice or bagatelle or other sedentary games nor bull, bear or badger baiting or cock fighting".

Of interest cock fighting was known to have been held in the village as there is reference to a cock pit at the top end of Moorland road.

In many cases these inns were one room in a farmhouse or cottage alongside a route to work and the beer was brewed on site.
