Community Council Chairman's Review

On behalf the Community Council may I wish all residents of the Parish a Happy Christmas and a Peaceful New Year.

The past year has been quite eventful and I want to thank our Clerk Clive Griffith and fellow Councillors for their support in dealing with all the issues that we have had to consider.

Early in the year we were advised by the Pembrokeshire County Council that any future elections and by-elections have to be funded by ourselves and this impacted on the amount we have to precept each year. The Data Protection Regulations also came into force requiring us to register with the Information Commissioners Office and sets out rules for how we handle data and personal information e.g. Electoral Register and any digitally held data.

As a representative of One Voice Wales Pembrokeshire Committee I have been involved with the County Council in developing a formal Charter on how Town and Community Councils and the County Council deal with each other on a whole range of issues such as planning, correspondence, complaints etc. Our Community Council have now ratified this document.

The review of the of the Local Development Plan by Pembrokeshire County Council grinds on – we await to see what candidate sites (for potential development) have been lodged the County Council for Freystrop. We understand that when the plan is produced it will elevate Freystrop to the category of a service village which may encourage more businesses and housing allocation.

The Community Council have a sub-committee looking after the Village Hall. We engaged a contractor to carry out external and interior improvements over the Summer. Bookings for the Hall are extremely good and offer a wide range of activities .It is also available for private functions.

The War years.

The older men formed the Home Guard(Dad's Army). These included Freddy Rowlands, Tommy Owen, Alfred Hughes, Billie Green and Tommy Bennett. A wooden hut was provided at High Freystrop where they met and trained. Those with cars did the outlyng areas. There was also a searchlight positioned in a field near the cemetery.



Little Nash Farm Christmas Recipe.

150g pancetta or smoked bacon. 2tbs oil.1tbspn juniper berries.

1tsp allspice.2.5g button mushroom 4 50ml beef stock.

200grms whole chestnuts.

1.2kg diced venison. 400g shallot.

6 thspn plain flour 2 Garlic cloves.

6.50ml red wine. 1 bay leaf. 1gg beaten.

50g pastry.

3 sprigs thyme.

In a large pan fry the pancetta & shallots peeled & halved for 10 mins remove from pan.

Using a little more oil fry venison in 2 batches. Return all to pan.

Add crushed garlic, juniper berries & all spice & cook for 1 minute. Add f lour & cook for another minute.

Add halved mushrooms pour in wine & stock, add herbs. Bring back to the boil, cover & simmer for 3 hours until tender, (this can be done in the oven). Stir in chestnuts remove from heat & cool completely.

Put in a large pie dish with enough gravy to reach the rim.

Roll out the pastry to thickness of £1 coin. Cut off some strips & wet the rim of the dish & press the pastry onto it.

Brush the strips with beaten egg &7 cover with remaining pastry.

Trim off remaining pastry . Knock up the edges to neaten & flute with the back of a knife of thumb.

Decorate the top with pastry trimmings in shape of leaves or deer antlers.

Bake in for oven220c or gas 7 for 30 mins until golden.

Serve with seasonal vegetables. Plenty of venison available locally over Christmas alternatively beef can be used instead.
